American Academy of Gold Foil Operators

Board Meeting, February 11, 1981

The council of the American Academy of Gold Foil Operators met at 1:00 p.m. Wednesday, February 11, 1981, in the Wright Room of the Hyatt Regency Hotel, Chicago, Illinois.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Dr. Perry Dungey. Members in attendance were Dr. Harold Schnepper, Dr. Norman Ferguson, Dr. Ron Harris, Dr. William Roberts, Dr. Nelson Rupp, Dr. Chester Gibson, Dr. Ian Hamilton, Dr. Marty Anderson, and Dr. Ralph Boelsche. Dr. Clifford Miller and Tony Ramano were visitors present.

The minutes of the last annual meeting were approved as read.

The financial report was approved as read. It was decided by the council to conduct an in-depth study of past operating expenses before adopting a new budget. Special consideration will be given to a possible increase in dues to meet rising costs.

Dr. Ian Hamilton and Dr. Marty Anderson gave a report on the status of the Journal. (See tabulation attached)

Dr. Harold Schnepper reported on the program plans for the October meeting to be in Oklahoma City. Outlines for speakers, hotel accommodations for meeting, reservations for room requests were discussed. The group voted to make October 4, 1981, as the deadline for room accommodations for the general meeting. It was decided by the council that the University State Bank of Houston be requested to send a letter of credit to Ms. Pam Levering at Hilton Inn N.W. in Oklahoma City.

Dr. Norman Ferguson reported on clinicians for the October meeting. It was decided that for optimum efficiency and effectiveness, there should be some guidelines for time of operating by the clinicians.

Programming for the up-coming meetings was discussed. It was voted that a letter of request be sent to the Dean of the Dental School of the University of Southern California for the 1982 meeting to be held in Las Vegas. A similar request is to go to the school at the University of California at Los Angeles projecting to the 1983 convention.

The matter of Gold Keys was brought before the group. It was decided that the Secretary inquire into the cost and order possibly ten. It could then be publicized at the annual meeting that keys are available to those who wish to purchase one.

It was decided that an appendage to the 1980 roster be printed and distributed in June 1981. The matter of deliquent members was discussed. It was stressed that deadlines for paying dues should be enforced.

Dr. James Vernetti reported that the Special Clinician Group had met with opposition from schools contacted thus far.

The council continued its study of revisions in the Constitution and By-Laws. Dr. Ron Harris assumed the responsibility of this assignment for the ensuing year.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Our Board met in Chicago on Wednesday, February 11, 1981, to discuss the routine business of the Academy. Our Secy-Treas., Dr. Ralph Boelsche, has indeed been busy and has his office running smoothly. Our projected budget expenditures will most certainly lead to a dues increase in the very near future. We dare not stand still! The report of the Operative Journal was most encouraging. I urge each of us to sell the Journal to a colleague this year; 500 new subscriptions would really help the financial picture.

Planning for our annual meeting at the University of Oklahoma is on schedule, and all units are at "go." Dr. Earl Collard is an invaluable member of our Academy!

Our Wednesday meeting opened at 1:00 p.m., and by 5:00 we had progressed to the perennial problem—Constitution and By Laws. Copies of the present By Laws were brought out, many with marginal comments by Dr. Jerry Stibbs and others. Other copies, some older, and some of the proposed changes were also in evidence. It was agreed that the time had come to meet the problem and solve it. A motion was made, seconded, and passed that the Board meet the following day for the sole purpose of reviewing the present instrument.

Thursday, February 12, 1981, at 3:30 p.m., the Board met and the entire document was reviewed and agreement made on the sum and substance of material to be added and changes to be made so the Academy may have a more meaningful and workable document. And, so we may keep the document current once we get the revision approved, we are creating a Constitution and By Laws Committee.

Dr. Ron Harris has volunteered to re-write the document and have it ready in April so we may present it to the membership in time to gain passage at our Annual Meeting in Oklahoma City.

This was a most productive and encouraging meeting; I thank the Board for their efforts.

Those in attendance were the Board of Directors, consisting of Boelsche, Secretary-Treasurer of the A.A.G.O.; Werner, Secretary-Treasurer A.O.D.; Laswell, A.O.D. President-elect; Gibson, A.A.G.O. Past President; Marty Anderson, President of the Board of Directors; lan Hamilton, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Journal.

Others in attendance were as follows: Wolcott, Cole, Eggleston, Tucker, Bill Roberts, Norm Ferguson, Clark, Gagnon, Cliff Miller, Schnepper, Greg

Smith, and Geistfeld.

Chairman of the Board Hamilton called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Hamilton requested the Secretary of the Board Werner to read the minutes of February 13, 1980. Minutes were approved, with the exception that Gibson's name was omitted as having been in attendance. Anderson moved to accept. Eggleston seconded.

Dr. Hamilton, the Editor, commented on questions asked in the 1980 minutes—re: sending Journals in plastic coverings not much cheaper and

much harder to wrap.

Dr. Hamilton noted that Dr. Boelsche gave a generous contribution to

the Journal in 1980.

Dr. Hamilton—Report of the Editor, January 1, 1980 · December 31, 1980 (See article). Boelsche moved to accept. Anderson seconded. Chairman Hamilton called for the Managing Editor Dr. Anderson's

Supplement of Journal will print Operative Section A.A.D.S. annual

meeting if material is applicable.

Financial report.

Dr. Anderson stresses the need for all student award recipients to send

their addresses of their new residence after graduation.

Dr. Jack Schultz, staff member University of Minnesota, stated that all Chairmen of Operative Departments get a notice about selecting student award recipient, with a copy to the Dean. It was suggested that all Deans be sent this notice, with a copy sent to the Chairman of the Restorative or Operative Department head where applicable.

Boelsche moved to accept Anderson's report. Seconded by Hamilton. Dr. Anderson next read Dr. Eames letter (see article). Dr. Eggleston said

that quality of articles is most important.

Dr. Hamilton stated that 10 months elapse before articles are presented, which is down from 1½ years. Editor Hamilton commented on how articles are accepted or rejected. Five judges are used to screen papers. The best and most accurate papers are chosen. If an article is accepted or rejected, a month or six weeks is the usual length of time used in the determination. If it is rejected, the paper is sent back to the author with comments.

Dr. Tucker stated four publications a year plus a supplement seems to be adequate, with the possibility of more pages to be added to the publication if

necessary to keep abreast with the backlog of material.

Hamilton stated that printing reprints at the time of publication costs

about one half the cost per unit at the time of printing.

Managing Editor Anderson discussed the proposed budget. He stated I.R.S. requires proposed budget for Volume 7 and probably Volume 8. He stated that \$3,000 may be used in advertising to promote subscriptions to our Journal in other Journals. However, it has been found in the past that the cost involved just about breaks even with new subscriptions.

Schnepper moved to accept the budget for 1981 and Boelsche seconded. Chairman Hamilton stated that the tenure of office for members of the Journal board was for three years. The present board consists of: Ralph Boelsche, Secretary-Treasurer, A.A.G.F.O.; Ralph Werner, Secretary-Treasurer, A.O.D.; Chester Gibson, Past President, A.A.G.F.O.; Harold Laswell, President, A.O.D.: Martin Anderson, President, Journal; Ian Hamilton, Chairman of the Board, Journal.

Hamilton and Anderson discussed foreign subscriptions, i.e., those outside the U.S.A. and Canada. It was decided to raise these subscriptions

\$10.00 to defray the costs of mailing the Journal by air mail.

Schnepper asked about the size and number of issues. Hamilton stated that there are four issues a year with forty-eight pages in each issue. Hamilton states that the subscription notices for all non-members of the Academies are sent out in the fall. Larry Clark raised the question about printing the A.A.D.S. Operative Section Annual Meeting essays in the supplement. Hamilton stated that in some years the essay program was not worthy of printing. Hamilton requested he needed more help in getting the paper in good English.

Larry Clark next stated that probably the supplement could be used to catch up on papers which are back-logged if the A.A.D.S. meeting has little

use for the supplement.

Dr. Clifford Miller stated we must have material that is very current. We must encourage people who are doing current research to submit their papers, which would help keep up the interest in the Journal. Miller stated our Journal is more specific to the needs of the Operative Dentist. The

Prosthetic Journal has a broader coverage of different material not necessarily relating to Operative Dentistry. Miller also stated that researchers in schools could be contacted as well as other individuals who are known to be doing much about submitting current material. Probably one article could be published in each issue from this source. Dr. Miller was asked to make these contacts with authors and schools about submitting material which is current and up to date. It was stated that very little duplication of material was now taking place.

Dr. Anderson next assumed the conducting roll of the meeting as the Chairman, Dr. Hamilton, who is also the Editor, left the meeting so that his

editorship could be discussed.

Article II of the constitution states that the Editor shall serve at the pleasure of the board. Laswell stated Dr. Hamilton needs more help. Dr. Marty Anderson states that Dr. Hamilton needs a copy editor to check references and other material. Dr. Anderson states that the two girls who are presently assisting Dr. Hamilton on a part-time basis should be used more.

Werner moved that we express a vote of confidence for Editor Hamilton for the year 1981. Boesche seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

After discussion, Werner proposed that Editor Hamilton and Managing Editor Anderson be allowed travel expenses, that is coach air fare and 2 days per-diem expenses for attending the annual meeting of the board in Chicago and also the semi-annual meeting held prior to the A.D.A. annual meeting. Boelsche seconded. The motion was unanimously carried.

President Anderson stated the 1500 plus subscriptions have been received by February 10, 1981. He also stated that it is the responsibility of all members of the Academies to verbally promote the Journal. All members should give their friends in dentistry a subscription card. Norm Ferguson stated that essayists and clinicians on the speaking circuit who are members should be contacted to promote subscriptions to the Journal.

Dr. Anderson next asked if further old or new business needed to be brought before the board. Hearing none, he next asked for a motion to adjourn. Boelsche so moved. Werner seconded. Motion carried, and adjournment was at 10:35 a.m.

Wilmer Eames Comments on Operative Dentistry

All of the journals are running from one to two years behind. It seems a shame that if something is worthwhile enough to accept, that it can't be published within a reasonable time.

I often hear from a number of people that they will send their manuscripts to the journal that they think will publish the soonest. Of course, they are all about the same. So, many articles are published in state journals, and are buried geographically forevermore, excepting in the indices of the libraries. There are very few state journals referenced.

It might not be practicable, but maybe next year you could play "catchup"—no new thought, I am sure. But perhaps your budget could allow a supplemental issue, and you could really go for prompt publications. You could then encourage better efforts from better (more competent) authors.

Hard fact: Many fellows feel that they must publish or 'perish' in some schools, and they turn out poorly prepared material to the low-subscription

journals that are available to them.

Operative Dentistry is a quality journal. Wouldn't it be great to have the reputation for being very selective—but having the capacity of publishing within a few months? Not considering the slowness of the reviewers, isn't it a little unrealistic to know that all of the major publications are so far behind? What is the final condition that brings the paper into print?

This whole question is probably so difficult that it isn't necessary to bring it up. But if it is budget—remind the Board that subscriptions will increase with the quality and accessibility of the journal. You work very hard perfecting every issue, and I think that you deserve all the support that you can get. Attracting better papers would be a big boost.

Operative Dentistry Shows Healthy Growth

Our journal, Operative Dentistry, after five years of publishing is showing a healthy sustained growth. The financial summary sheet shows a net gain of \$11,391.94. Considering the complexities of publication in these inflationary times, we can certainly compliment our Editor, Ian Hamilton, and his able managing editor, Martin Anderson, for their tireless efforts in our behalf.

Although the complete report is too lengthy to publish in the Gold Leaf, it is encouraging to observe that each year has shown substantial gains in

subscriptions and prestige in the dental profession.

Our gift and subscriptions to our publication are vital to its success. On this same page are some comments from Dr. Wilmer Eames, one of dentistry's outstanding researchers and a regular contributor to Operative Dentistry.

The above does not include editorials, points of view, book reviews, letters from Europe, and articles about the Hollenback Prize and Distinguished Member Award. Our waiting time for publication is now about ten months.

Pure Gold: An innovation this year has been the re-publication of classic articles on gold foil. These articles are scattered throughout the literature, and some of the journals are exceedingly difficult to obtain. We are contemplating the eventual publication of these articles in a book so that they will be more readily available.

Supplement: Early in 1981 we expect to publish Supplement Number 2, containing the programs of the annual meetings for 1979 and 1980 of the Section on Operative Dentistry of the American Association of Dental Schools. The titles of the programs are "The Profile of a Teacher of Operative Dentistry" and "The Need for Graduate Education in Operative Dentistry." Part of the cost of publication is to be defrayed by eight manufacturers, who have contributed \$2,400.
