The American Board of Operative Dentistry at its recent annual meeting elected the officers for the coming year. They are Dr. David Molien of Iowa City, Iowa – Secretary/Treasurer; Dr. Chester Gibson of McMinnville, Oregon – Vice President; and Dr. James Gourley of Bainbridge Island, Washington – President.

Also at the annual meeting, Dr. Robert C. Keene of Hanover, New Hampshire; Dr. Gibson and Dr. Molien were elected to the council which is the governing body for the American Board of Operative Dentistry.

The American Board of Operative Dentistry is celebrating its tenth year since inception. The concept for establishing the Board certification process for general dentists in restorative dentistry was spawned by members of the American Academy of Operative Dentistry in 1980.

The organization is incorporated in the State of Florida and serves to encourage practicing dentists to participate in the certification process whereby they undergo a lengthy written examination, the preparation of cases for an oral examination, and then a practical exam which covers all phases of restorative dentistry.
