The agenda for the meeting was distributed to all present. Minutes of the September 10, 1998 annual meeting were approved at published in the Gold Leaf in January.

Treasurer's report and Budget for 1999 were accepted. Bob Keene was slated to do an internal audit of books and suggested that all seemed to be in order. Board members concurred.

#### Correspondence:

A letter from NIDR inviting AAGFO to join as contributing member. Response of the group was lukewarm and no action was taken.

Dick McCoy's report showed that things are running smoothly with the Journal. Good manuscripts continue to be received. 94 were received in 1998 and 49 were accepted for publication. There were 27 more subscriptions than at the same time in 1997. Almost 2000 issues were mailed. The Institute for Scientific Information has listed our Journal as having the 11th most important impact compared to other journals - JADA is 20th and JPD is 29th. The symposium on amalgam alternatives, undertaken by Dr. Dan Sneed may be held in late fall of 2000. The OpDent Home-page has received over 4000 "searches" since last

Pages have increased to 64 pages per issue in an effort to catch up. Additional referees have been added to avoid overloading those presently serving.

Publishing and editing responsibilities will be assumed by the new editor, Mike Cochran by around January 1st of 2000. Tim Carlson will be taking over duties as Managing Editor as soon as possible after this meeting.

Marty Anderson gave the financial report, which shows a very slight operating loss for the year, and the fund equity is very healthy. Marty has served as Managing Editor since the inception of the Journal, a period of about 25 years. He has been most instrumental in developing one of the premier international dental journals, with subscribers in 54 coun-

A vote of gratitude was extended to Dick and Marty by the Board for their excellence and dedication in their roles with the Journal.

Tim suggested that funds may be requested from both Academies to update equipment and supplies needed to keep the Journal up to its high standards.

#### Plans for 1999 meeting:

Oct. 27-30 - Nashville, TN. Tim has things very well in order with some excellent speakers on various related subjects. Dick is working on obtaining clinicians. It is planned to have a two day session in order to accommodate the students. Evaluation process for clinicians used in Minneapolis seemed to work very well, as well as personal critiques. The hotel will be the Sheraton Music City.

#### Future meetings:

2000 - Nov. 1-4. We will be using the Navy facilities at Pearl Harbor, with a Thursday pm session. Hotel will be the Ihilani Resort and Spa.

2001 — Tentative plans to meet in Indianapolis. Dates to be determined — possibly last week in September (26-29).

Literature and Research — Bibliography update is ongoing. Fred is still waiting for input from the Samuel Harris Museum in Baltimore. There is one room left that might possibly be used as an exhibit for gold as well as other restorative materials. Funds of about \$40,000 may be needed to sponsor such an effort, possibly through contributions by individuals. "Seed Money" from this Academy may be a possibility. There is a need for a 3-4 person committee to work with the Museum on the concept. Craig appointed Fred to head the committee

Nominating — Scott Barrett has been nominated to serve on the Board.

Interacademy Liaison - Nothing other than Journal business.

Public Relations - No report.

Education and Clinical Seminars — No report.

Necrology — Two deaths reported: Norm Olsen and Bennett Hooker.

Outstanding Clinician - Not yet determined, but candidate should be selected by

April.

Distinguished Member — No report.

Constitution and Bylaws — Mel Lund and committee have suggested that a Public Relations Committee has not really been functional and some of it's alleged functions fall under the purview of the Education and Clinical Seminars group. The PRCommittee could be handled as an ad hoc one. Board concurred to approve a proposal in concept to eliminate the Public Relations Committee and transfer pertinent functions to the Education and Clinical Seminars Committee.

#### **New Business:**

Some of the above items can be considered new business.

Woody suggested that the Glossary of Dental Terms and Nomenclature may need some revision, as pointed out by certain readers of the Journal. This may be shared with the Operative Academy, as to responsibility and cost.







### Dr. William W. Howard dies at age 76



William W. Howard, DDS

The Portland dentist wrote seven books relating to his field and served in a number of professional positions

Dr. William W. Howard, a prominent Portland dentist who served in a variety of top professional posts and wrote several acclaimed books on dentistry, died April 21. He was 76.

A private service will be held.

After graduating from the University of Oregon Dental School in 1950, Dr. Howard maintained a private practice in downtown Portland for 23 years until 1973. He then became professor and chairman of the department of fixed prothodontics at Oregon Health Sciences University and served in that capacity for 21 years until retiring in 1994.

Dr. Howard was involved in organizations related to his field for many years. He was president of the Oregon Dental Association in 1969–70 and the Multnomah Dental Society in 1963–64. He served two terms as president of the Oregon Board of Dentistry. Additionally, he was a past president of the Western Association of Dental Examiners and Dental School Deans and a former supreme president of Xi Psi Phi dental fraternity.

He was the author of seven books relating to his field, most of which were translated into several languages and published internationally. Several of his texts are in use by students at OHSU Dental School.

Dr. Howard — a contributing author to four other books who wrote hundreds of papers, articles and editorials — was honored with several prestigious journalistic awards, including the Geis Editorial Award, the International College of Golden Pen, the Golden Pencil and the Golden Scroll.

He did volunteer work for the hospital staff of Shriners Hospital for Children from 1966 until 1993 and was named Oregon General Dentist of the Year in 1970.

He was a life member of the American Dental Association and served as an adviser or members of its councils. He served as editor of the Journal of the Academy of General Dentistry for 22 years until retiring as editor emeritus in 1996.

He became a member of the Academy of General Dentistry in 1962 and was named editor of publications in 1974; the organization honored him with the distinction of mastership in 1993.

He was born April 25, 1922, in Ontario. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy, in 1942 and served in the South Pacific during World War II. After his discharge, he returned to his studies at Oregon State University and graduated in 1946. He became affiliated with the Naval Dental Corps Reserve in 1951, retiring as captain in 1978.

Survivors, all of Portland, include his wife, Emma-Jane; sons, Dr. John P. Shaw and David M.J.; daughters, Jane S. Martin and Alexandra S. Woodworth; and five grandchildren.

Private internment will be in River View Cemetery. The family suggests remembrances to the Oregon Health Sciences Foundation to benefit the Dr. William W.
